THE REVEREND JAMES C. PERKINS, D. MIN.



The Reverend Dr. James C. Perkins was ordained to Gospel Ministry in 1974. He is Pastor Emeritus of Greater Christ Baptist Church in Detroit, Michigan, where he served for forty-two years. He received his Doctor of Ministry degree from United Theological Seminary, Dayton, Ohio (1990, Samuel DeWitt Proctor Fellow). Dr. Perkins also served as the 20th President of the Progressive National Baptist Convention (2014-2018).

An internationally recognized minister, Dr. Perkins has fulfilled speaking engagements at churches, seminaries, and conferences across the United States and abroad.

He is the author of *Building Up Zion's Walls: Ministry for Empowering the African American Family*, *Playbook for Christian Manhood: 12 Key Plays for Black Teen Boys*, (published by Judson Press, Valley Forge, Pennsylvania), *Midnight Religion: Messages of Victory in the Midst of Adversity* and *Staking Claim to Your Mountain: Sermons of Empowerment and Endurance*. His other writings, as well as profiles of his ministry and details of his community activism, have been included in both secular and Christian publications such as *Black Enterprise*, *USA Today*, *Ebony*, *American Baptist*, *The African-American Pulpit*, several edited works published by Judson Press, and the best-selling *Success Runs in Our Race* by George Fraser.

Believing that the church has a responsibility to serve both the temporal as well as the spiritual needs of the surrounding community, Dr. Perkins established numerous enterprises that support that vision. In 1992, he founded the Fellowship Nonprofit Housing Corporation as a vehicle for community economic development. In the spring of 2006, Providence Place was constructed. This \$10 million development provides fifty single family homes for low and middle income families. Responding to the crisis he witnessed in the available educational options for young, urban African American males, Dr. Perkins instituted the Benjamin E. Mays Male Academy in 1993. This kindergarten through sixth grade Christian school for boys operated for 17 years and positively impacted the futures of hundreds of males. In 2014, during his tenure as President of the Progressive National Baptist Convention, Dr. Perkins established the Progressive National Baptist Convention Community Development Corporation (PNBC CDC) and led in the construction of Providence Place, a \$27 million housing complex located on the campus of The Progressive National Baptist Convention headquarters in Washington, DC. It consists of 93 units and held its grand opening on July 28, 2022.

Dr. Perkins serves on the NAACP National Board of Directors, and was formerly an Adjunct Professor at the Interdenominational Theological Center (ITC), Atlanta, GA, and formerly, a trustee at his alma mater, Wiley College, Marshall TX. Dr. Perkins has served as a past President of the Michigan Progressive Baptist Convention. He is a member of the Detroit Baptist Pastors Council, Detroit Chapter of the NAACP, and is a Life Member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc.

He was a recipient of the Ghandi, King, Ikeda Award, Morehouse College, Atlanta, GA, the Pastor of the Year Award, Southern Christian Leadership Conference, the Benjamin E. Mays Award, Howard University, Washington, D.C., the Charles Andrew Hill Achievement Award, Michigan Progressive Baptist Convention, Michigan Chronicle's Pastor's Salute Award, Who's Who in Black Detroit (Inaugural Edition), the Outstanding Church Leadership Award, American Baptist Churches of Michigan, Distinguished Warriors Award, Detroit Urban League, National Newspaper Publishers Association Power in the Pulpit Award, the HBCU Game Changers Award (Kentucky State University Alumni), 2018 Rainbow PUSH Church Community Award and the Coalition of Schools Educating Boys of Color (COSEBOC) 2019 Champions Award. In 2022, he was inducted into the Martin Luther King, Jr. Board of Preachers at Morehouse College in Atlanta, GA.

Dr. Perkins is married to Linda Adkins Perkins and is the father of two daughters, the grandfather of two grandsons, and the great grandfather of one great grandson.

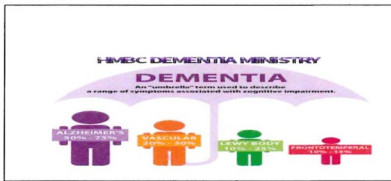

SOCIAL JUSTICE CORNER: ELECTION NEWS: 2026

MICHIGAN'S STATEWIDE PRIMARY IS TUESDAY, AUGUST 4.

- ◆ On Election Day, polls are open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m.
- ◆ The mandatory early voting period — when local communities are required to offer early, **in-person voting** — **for the primary election, runs from Saturday, July 25, through Sunday, Aug. 2.** Hours for early voting will vary by location. In Michigan, eligible voters can also submit absentee ballots to vote by mail.

MICHIGAN'S GENERAL ELECTION IS TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3.

- ◆ Polls again will be open on Election Day from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. **The mandatory early voting period runs from Saturday, Oct. 24, through Sunday, Nov. 1.**

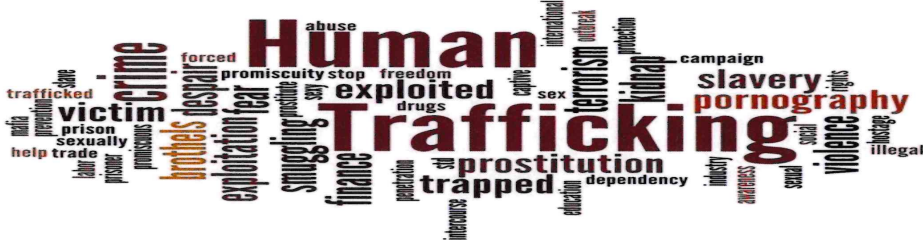

AFRICAN-AMERICAN HERITAGE REFLECTION

A PIECE OF CIVIL RIGHTS HISTORY FINDS A HOME IN MICHIGAN

A key piece of civil rights history has been permanently relocated to Michigan where its powerful story will be preserved and shared. The Henry Ford in Dearborn has acquired the Jackson Home – the former Selma, Alabama home of Dr. And Mrs. Sullivan Jackson – for its Greenfield Village outdoor museum.

The home was a safe haven and planning site for the 1965 Selma-to-Montgomery marches. During the height of the fight for voting rights, civil rights leaders including Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. gathered in the Jacksons' home to organize and strategize. That's also where Dr. King watched President Lyndon B. Johnson's "We Shall Overcome" speech – the announcement that would lead to the Voting Rights Act of 1965.



In February 1964, Martin Luther King Jr., Southern Christian Leadership Conference staff, and members of Congress met for strategy sessions to plan the Selma to Montgomery marches in Jackson's Selma, Alabama home. After the first attempted march on March 7, 1965 (known as Bloody Sunday), Assistant U. S. Attorney General John Doar and Florida Governor LeRoy Collins, the latter of whom was there representing President Lyndon Johnson, met with King and others at Jackson's house. This led to a second attempt at a voting rights march from Selma to Montgomery, and finally a third and successful attempt. It was also in Jackson's home that Martin Luther King Jr. watched Lyndon Johnson give his Voting Rights Act Address on March 15, 1965.

The house, preserved with some of its original furnishings, includes a maple dining table where influential civil rights leaders met, the upholstered armchair where Dr. King watched President Johnson's address, and the bedroom where Dr. King stayed during his time in Selma.

The Henry Ford acquired the home in 2023 after Jawana Jackson, the daughter of Dr. And Mrs. Jackson and the home's sole owner, requested the museum relocate it and ensure its legacy. The house and its contents were transported 1,060 miles from Alabama to Michigan, and in 2024 the home was installed in the Porches & Parlors district of Greenfield Village. The Grand Opening for the home is June 12-16, 2026.

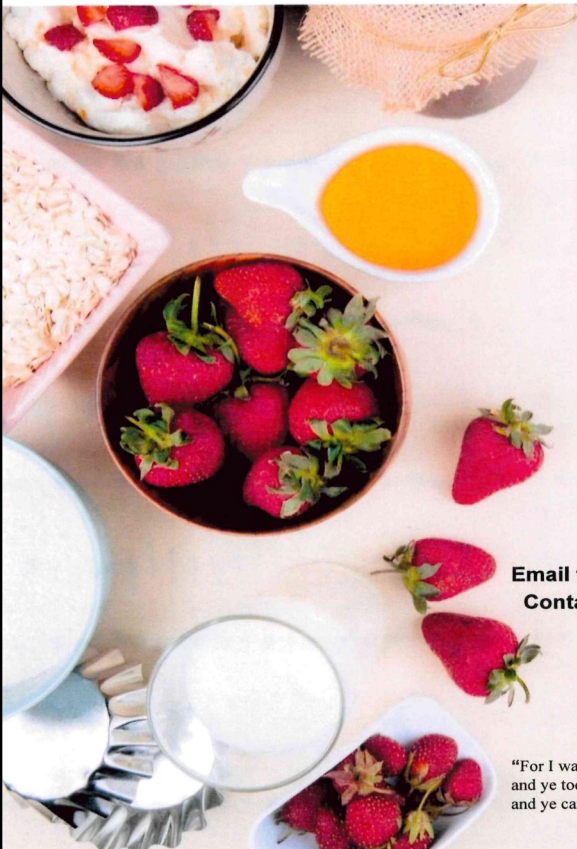

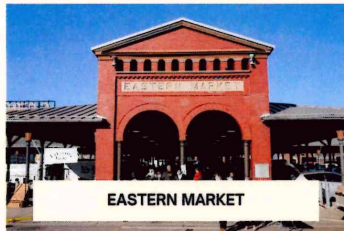

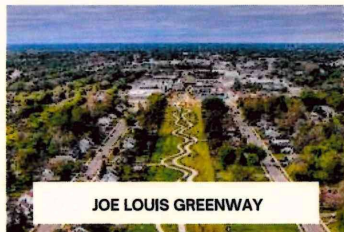
