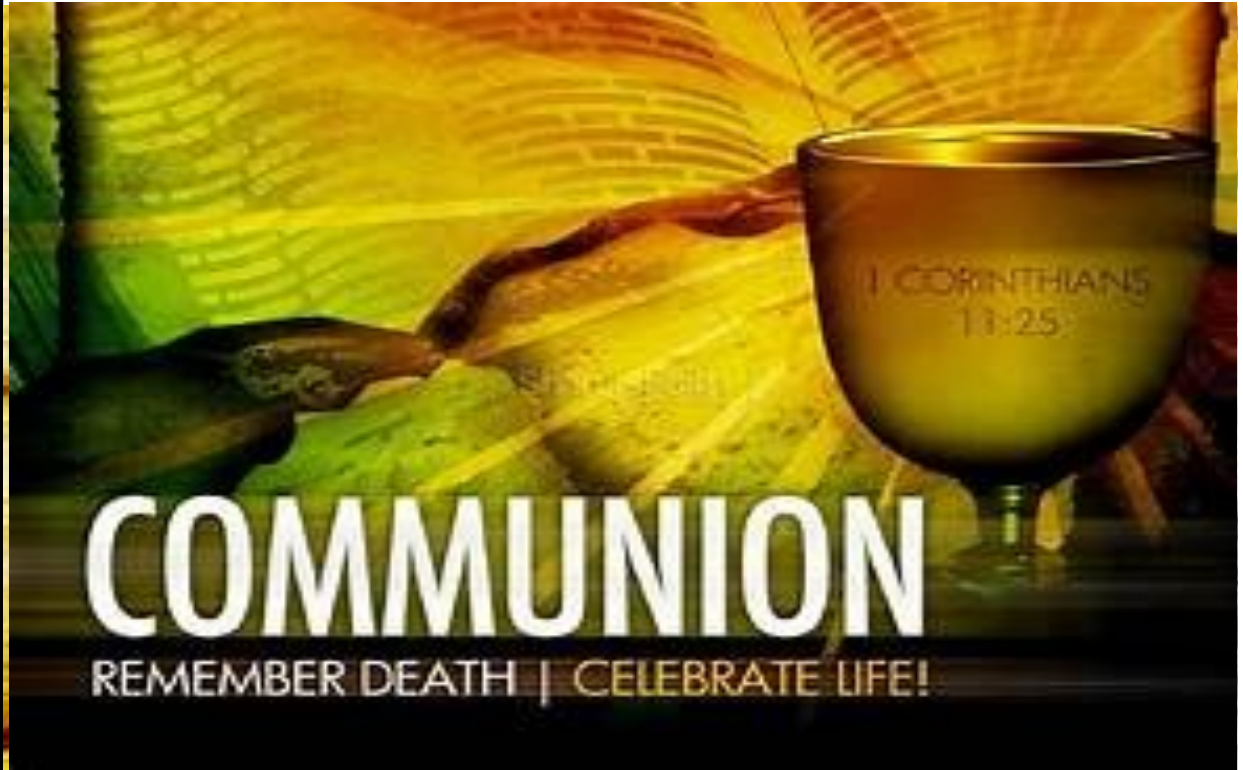

REV. DR. FREDERICK DOUGLASS HAYNES III

SENIOR PASTOR, FRIENDSHIP WEST BAPTIST CHURCH, DALLAS, TX



Rev. Dr. Frederick Douglass Haynes III, is a prophetic pastor, passionate leader, social activist, eloquent orator, and educator engaged in preaching the gospel of Jesus Christ, and fighting against racial injustice. Dr. Haynes is also committed to and has devoted his life to economic justice and empowerment in under-served communities and touching and transforming the lives of the disenfranchised. For the past 40 years, Dr. Haynes has served as a visionary and innovative senior pastor of Friendship-West Baptist Church in Dallas, Texas. Under his servant leadership, the ministry and membership of the church has grown from less than 100 members in 1983 to over 13,000.

On November 10, 1960, Rev. Dr. Frederick D. Haynes, III was born in Dallas, Texas to the late Rev. Frederick D. Haynes, Jr., and Lynetta Haynes-Oliver. After experiencing racism in the segregated south, Dr. Haynes' father decided it was best to move his family to San Francisco where his father, Dr. Frederick D. Haynes Sr., pastored the historic Third Baptist Church. In San Francisco, California both Dr. Haynes' father and grandfather led ministries that were socially conscious and active in the community. At the age of 14, Dr. Haynes' life took a drastic turn when his father passed away on his first day of high school. Following his father's death, Dr. Haynes encountered many difficulties but with the help of mentors, his family, and God, he was able to overcome every obstacle. Despite being discouraged by a teacher's negative assessment of his academic ability, he was one of three valedictory speakers when he graduated from Abraham Lincoln High School in San Francisco. Dr. Haynes continued his education at Bishop College in Dallas, Texas and graduated with honors in 1982 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Religion and English. While a student at Bishop College, he also became a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated. In 1996, he earned a Master of Divinity degree from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. In 2005, Dr. Haynes received his Doctor of Ministry from the Graduate Theological Foundation where he was afforded the opportunity to study at Christ Church, Oxford University in Oxford, England. His dissertation, "To Turn the World Upside Down: Church Growth in a Church Committed to Social Justice" reflects his commitment to faith based social activism. Currently, Dr. Haynes is a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) candidate at the Christian Theological Seminary in Indianapolis, Indiana where he is studying African American preaching and sacred rhetoric.

In 1983, Dr. Haynes accepted the call to become Senior Pastor of Friendship-West Baptist Church. Since then the church has grown numerically and in ministry to the Dallas community and around the world. Under Dr. Haynes' leadership, Friendship-West Baptist Church has moved three times to accommodate its growth. When Friendship-West Baptist Church moved to its Kiest location, it moved to a community characterized by crime and violence. Dr. Haynes led Friendship-West Baptist Church to work with local officials and neighborhood groups in such a way that the community experienced a decrease in the crime rate.

After incumbent Jasmine Crockett announced that she would run for the U.S. Senate in the 2026 election, Haynes announced that he would run to succeed her in the U.S. House of Representatives for Texas's 30th congressional district. He was endorsed by Crockett to succeed her, as well as by state representative Chris Turner, Tarrant County Commissioner Alisa Simmons and by Kirk Johnson, the son of Crockett's predecessor, the late Rep. Eddie Bernice Johnson. Kirk Johnson said at Haynes' launch event that Haynes was like an adopted son to his mother, and she would have encouraged voters to support him. Haynes' campaign has also been endorsed by Justice Democrats and the Texas AFL-CIO.

On March 3, 2026, Haynes won the Democratic primary for the 30th congressional district, defeating former state representative Barbara Mallory Caraway and pastor Rodney LaBruce. Dr. Haynes is married to Debra Peek-Haynes, Founder and President of Quorum Commercial, a commercial real estate firm. They are the proud parents of one adult daughter, Abeni Jewel Haynes.

SOCIAL JUSTICE CORNER: ELECTION NEWS: 2026

MICHIGAN'S STATEWIDE PRIMARY IS TUESDAY, AUGUST 4.

- ◆ On Election Day, polls are open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m.
- ◆ The mandatory early voting period — when local communities are required to offer early, **in-person voting** — **for the primary election, runs from Saturday, July 25, through Sunday, Aug. 2.** Hours for early voting will vary by location. In Michigan, eligible voters can also submit absentee ballots to vote by mail.

MICHIGAN'S GENERAL ELECTION IS TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3.

- ◆ Polls again will be open on Election Day from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. **The mandatory early voting period runs from Saturday, Oct. 24, through Sunday, Nov. 1.**

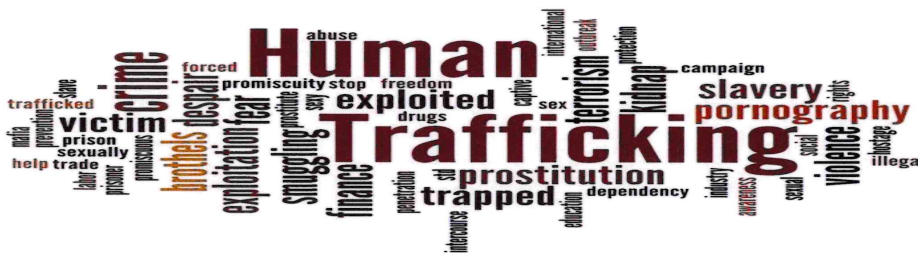

STRENGTHENING EACH OTHER AND ADORNING THE TEACHINGS OF OUR LORD AND SAVIOR

We further agree to walk together in Christian love and watchfulness, giving and receiving admonition with meekness and affection, to remember each other in prayer, to aid each other in sickness and distress, to cultivate Christian sympathy in feeling and courtesy in speech, to be slow to take offense, but always ready for reconciliation, and mindful of the rules of our Savior, to secure it without delay.

BEYOND THE REACHES OF THIS CHURCH

We, moreover, engage that, when we remove from this place, we will as soon as possible unite with some other church where we can carry out the spirit of this covenant and the principles of God’s word.

Humbly confessing our past sins, we pray for grace and strength to keep these, our holy vows, for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN
