Reverend Dr. Jessica Ingram is an anointed Spiritual Director, speaker, and author delivering over 44 years of notable achievement in helping individuals develop and sustain strong relationships with God. As Founder of The Ingram Difference, Rev. Dr. Jessica masterfully cultivates a trusted, sacred, and safe space for spiritual formation. Her engaging and personalized approach allows individuals to examine their spiritual growth for a life filled with focus, purpose, and fulfillment.

Rev. Dr. Jessica is a devout woman of service. For years, she has been recognized as a visionary, noblewoman of excellence, and pillar of hope throughout global communities. Rev. Jessica retired in July 2021 from serving the African Methodist Episcopal Church for 45 years. She served churches in Alton, Springfield, Chicago, Illinois and Detroit, Michigan. She became known for establishing powerful ministry to women and giving outstanding women's convocation. Additionally, served as Episcopal Supervisor in the AME Church in the 15th District (South Africa), the 10th District (state of Texas) and the 1st District. (states in the eastern corridor).

She is the Founder of the L.I.F.T. Women's Center in Detroit, MI which provided essential resources for restoration and empowerment to over 30,000 women recovering from physical, mental, and substance abuse. In 2003, Reverend Jessica established the Balm in Gilead Centre: The Healing Place for Women, equipping unemployed, uneducated, and underserved women in the impoverished settlement of Wallacedene, South Africa, with premier medical, educational, and professional resources.

Encompassed with unparalleled compassion to help women excel, Rev. Dr. Jessica also founded the Women of Hope Project, Inc., formerly headquartered in Dallas, Texas. This groundbreaking advocacy group actively worked to improve the physical, spiritual, emotional, and financial well-being of underserved women.

With this same compassion, Rev. Dr. Jessica propels clients on an authentic journey of self-exploration to achieve spiritual formation. She is a trained listener and accompanies clients on their journey as a trusted Director and friend. Her comprehensive service suite helps clients to discern God's presence, provision and power and the workings of the Holy Spirit in their lives, while helping to identify their personal reactions and responses.

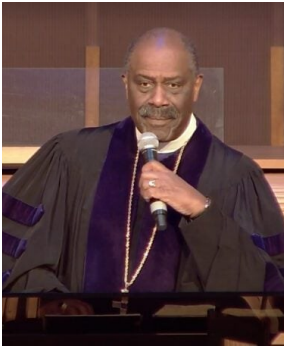
An expert instructor, Rev. Dr. Jessica has taught Spiritual Formation across America for over 30 years. She was a featured lecturer at the Hampton Institute, where she addressed spiritual formation throughout the lives of pastors. In addition, she designed a signature program training laypersons to become Spiritual Companions. She is the author of three dynamic books: *The Journey Inward*, *Still on the Journey*, and *Journey in the Experience of Prayer*. After her retirement, Dr. Jessica founded The Ingram Difference. This God given vision provides a variety of experiences that are essential for the spiritual growth of persons. Her website www.theingramdifference.com gives details about the services provided.

Rev. Dr. Jessica is an advocate *and* model for higher education and spiritual growth and development. She earned a Bachelor of Arts in Special Education from the University of Missouri, a Master of Arts in Guidance and Counseling from St. Louis University, a Master of Religious Education from Garrett Evangelical Theological Seminary, and a Doctor of Ministry in Spirituality from United Theological Seminary. She trained in Spiritual Direction at the Colombiere Center in Clarkston, Michigan and was the first protestant African American to study at this center.

Rev. Dr. Jessica has been married to the love of her life, Bishop Gregory G.M. Ingram, for 45 years. They are the parents of one daughter, Jennifer Eman Keanner married to Gregory McCoy, and have two gifted granddaughters, Gabby and Jayda.

Through meaningful conversations, curriculum, fellowship, prayer, and proven resources, Reverend Jessica helps clients from all walks of life better understand their uniqueness, God's purpose in their lives, and how to live out the best relationship with God.

REV. DR. GREGORY G. M. INGRAM
Presiding Prelate of the First Episcopal District, Retired
African Methodist Episcopal Churches



Bishop Gregory Gerald McKinley Ingram, a Detroit native, was elected the 118th Bishop of the African Methodist Episcopal Church in 2000. He served the 15th, 10th, and 1st Episcopal Districts, advancing a holistic, multi-dimensional ministry model. His signature 7-Point Partnership Plan evolved into a 10-Point Plan and later into the transformative strategic document known as “The Big Picture.”

Upon retiring in 2021, he became Professor of Leadership and Director of the Mapping the Future of Black Methodism Initiative at Payne Theological Seminary.

Before his election to the Episcopacy, Bishop Ingram pastored Oak Grove AME Church (Detroit) for 12½ years, where the church grew significantly: 2,600 new members, 1,420 tithers, full debt liquidation, a multi-million-dollar expansion, four commercial property acquisitions, and a men’s recovery house. He previously pastored AME churches in Chicago, Springfield, and Alton (IL) and served on the religious staff at Southern Illinois University–Edwardsville.

A recognized authority on stewardship and tithing, Bishop Ingram authored numerous publications, including *The S.A.T. Manual on African Methodism*, *Equipping the Saints for Service*, *The Joy of Giving More Than Enough*, *The AME Pastor’s Journal*, *Go Preach My Gospel*, *Ain’t That Good News?*, *He Restoreth My Soul*, and his forthcoming work, *The Mantle and The Master*.

He chaired the 49th General Conference Commission, and in 2016 served as chairman of the Bicentennial Committee and host bishop for the historic 50th Quadrennial Session in Philadelphia. He compiled and edited two major Bicentennial publications: *Moments of Meditation* (365-day devotional) and *The Encyclopedia of African Methodism*. He also conceived the Bicentennial Torch Run, raising over \$200,000 for cancer research, and envisioned the Richard Allen Statue and Memorial Courtyard at Mother Bethel AME Church. Together with his wife, Rev. Dr. Jessica Kendall Ingram, he created the 25×45-foot Richard Allen legacy mural at the First District Plaza in Philadelphia.

Bishop Ingram holds degrees from Wilberforce University (B.A.), Antioch College (M.A.T.), Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary (M.Div.), and United Theological Seminary (D.Min.). His leadership roles include chairing the Boards of Trustees for the AME Church, Payne Theological Seminary, and Paul Quinn College. He is a life member of the NAACP, a member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc., and a 33rd Degree Mason (Prince Hall).

He is married to Rev. Dr. Jessica Kendall Ingram and is the proud father of Jennifer Eman’ Keanner and grandfather to Jayda Eman’ and Gabrielle.

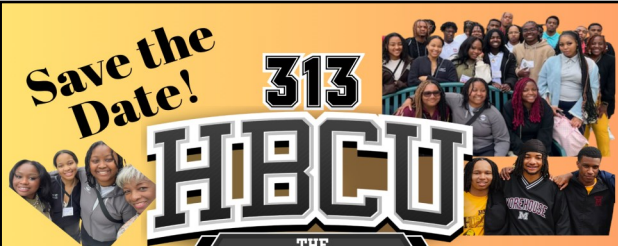
