AFRICAN-AMERICAN HERITAGE REFLECTION

BIRMINGHAM, AL — 1963

There are some things, even horrific things, we have to remember, so we don't allow them to be repeated. This is one.

The **16th Street Baptist Church bombing** was a terrorist bombing of the 16th Street Baptist Church in Birmingham, Alabama, on September 15, 1963. The bombing was committed by the white supremacist terrorist group the Ku Klux Klan (KKK). Four members of a local KKK chapter planted 19 sticks of dynamite attached to a timing device beneath the steps located on the east side of the church.



Described by Martin Luther King Jr. as "one of the most vicious and tragic crimes ever perpetrated against humanity," the explosion at the church killed four girls and injured between 14 and 22 other people.

The 1965 investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation determined the bombing had been committed by four known KKK members and segregationists: Thomas Edwin Blanton Jr., Herman Frank Cash, Robert Edward Chambliss, and Bobby Frank Cherry. However, it was not until 1977 that the first suspect, Robert Chambliss, was prosecuted by Attorney General of Alabama William "Bill" Baxley and convicted of the first degree murder of one of the victims, 11-year-old Carol Denise McNair.

As part of an effort by state and federal prosecutors to reopen and try cold cases involving murder and domestic terrorism from the civil rights era, the State of Alabama placed both Blanton and Cherry on trial; they were each convicted of four counts of first degree murder and sentenced to life imprisonment in 2001 and 2002, respectively. Future United States Senator Doug Jones successfully prosecuted Blanton and Cherry. Herman Cash died in 1994, and was never charged with his alleged involvement in the bombing.



The 16th Street Baptist Church bombing marked a turning point in the United States during the civil rights movement and also contributed to support for the passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 by Congress.

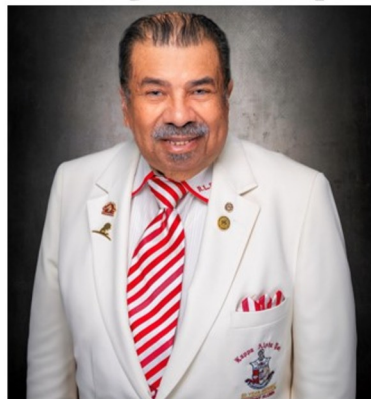

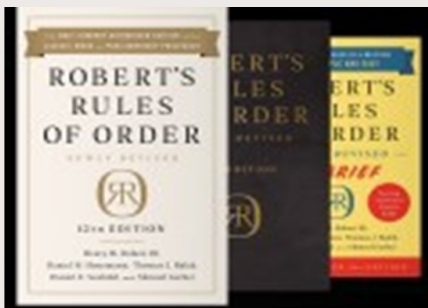

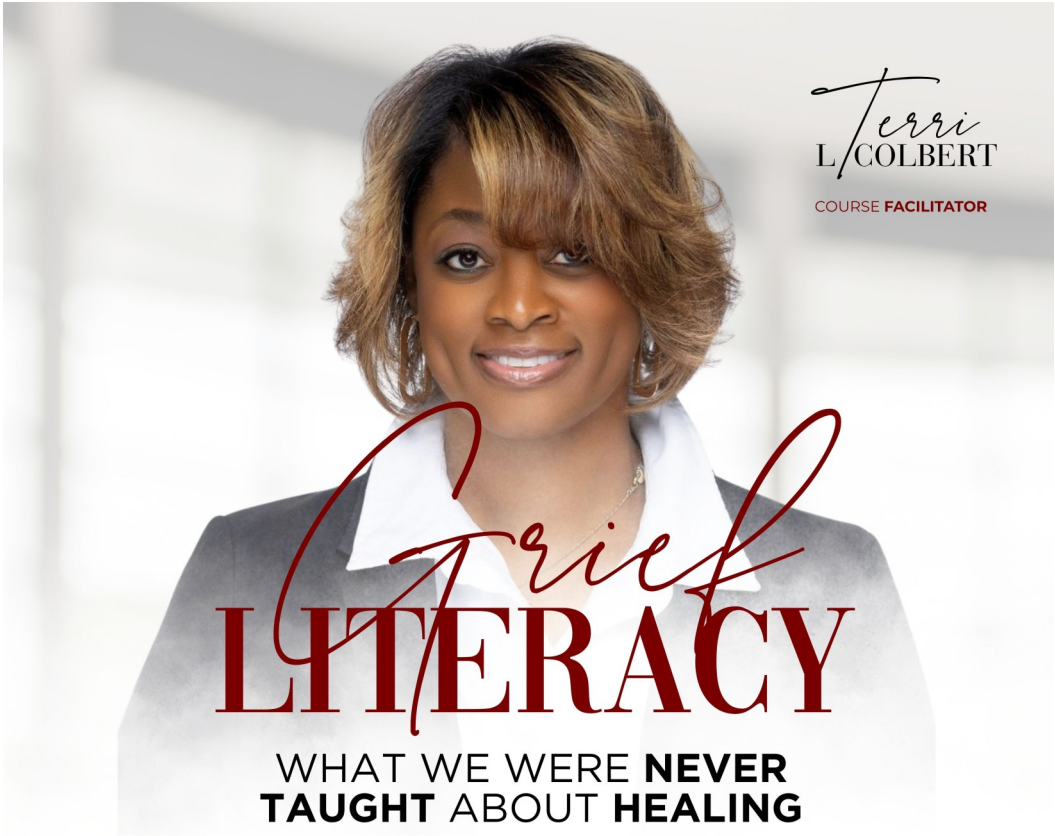

The Journey

The day I read about the March to Defend the Vote, I made up my mind to go. I had no idea of the where or how, but I was determined to go. Growing up in the 50's, I watched the TV reports of the vicious dogs and fire hoses, the bombings, the beatings and the murders with fear and sorrow. Like thousands of others, I believed in the righteousness of our cause, but I was never physically present to stand in solidarity with our brothers and sisters.

During the journey to the Washington March to Defend the Vote Reverend Fields was driving in the Allegheny Mountains after a fresh rain. We found ourselves driving into a rainbow. It was a mystical moment that recalled a phrase from Amanda Gorman's poem, The Hill We Climb, "the hill we climb if only we dare it. Because being American is more than a pride we inherit - it's the past we step into and how we repair it."

The movement surrounding the fight for our Civil Rights in this country is one of the proudest moments in recorded human history. The names of men and women who tapped into their mustard seed faith to move mountains are too numerous to record in history books, but they stand in the great cloud of witnesses watching over us urging us to stay woke. I wanted to be a part of the August 2026 March in Washington. I wanted to touch the monument to Dr King and whisper, "We are still fighting. We have not forgotten your work or our responsibility."

The poet reminds us (as if we needed a reminder) that "being Black is hard to do". Our people have struggled in this country for centuries. We have struggled and fought through chattel slavery, Jim Crow, poverty, segregation, worn out housing, failed education, and backdoor healthcare. Some of the labels have changed, but the venomous product is still the same. The struggle is not done.

We have all been nourished from wells we did not dig. We have crossed into opportunity on bridges we did not build; and walked through doors of achievement that we did not open. Our assignment is to work together to make sure these wells, bridges, and doors remain open for our children and our children's children. We must live and breathe in the mantra of our brother Nelson Mandela, who in response to a reporter, asking if he was ready to retire after he stepped down from the presidency in South Africa, replied, "The struggle is my life."

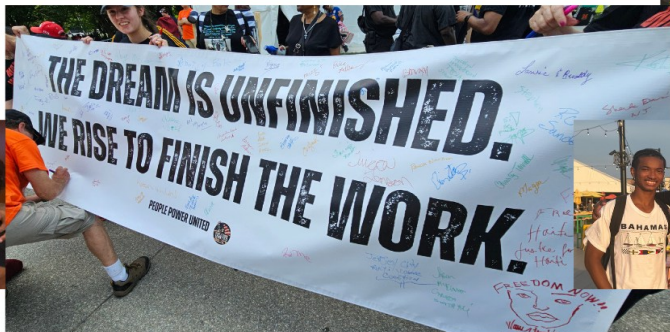
Going to Washington was a joyous taste of solidarity with sisters and brothers from Maine, to Texas and New York to California. Many were too young to have known Dr King, however they were versed and committed to his work with voting rights.

Paul tells us in Romans 5:3-4 "We rejoice in our struggle because we know that struggle produces perseverance; perseverance; character and character; hope." We continue the struggle to birth perseverance which shapes our character and renews our hope.
